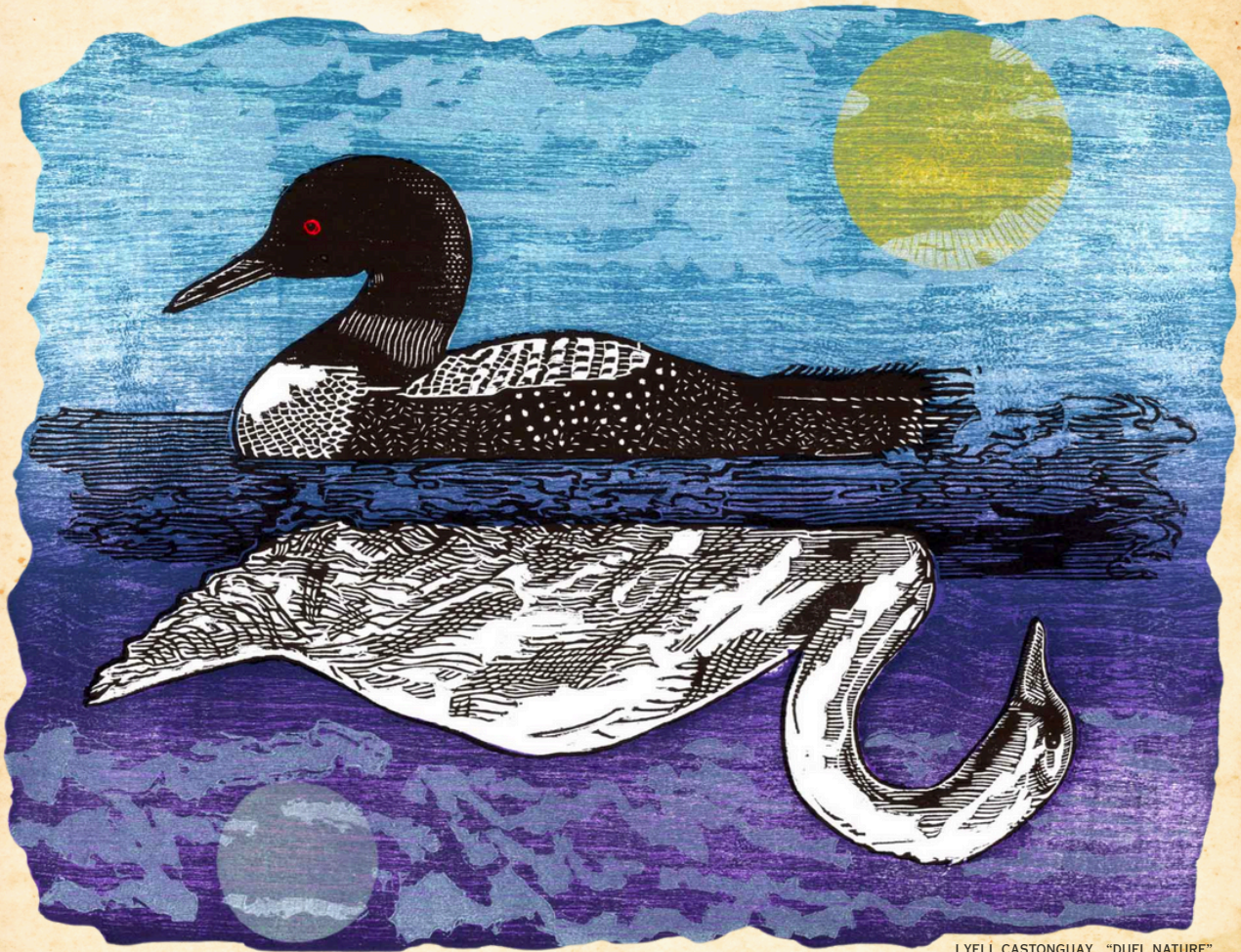

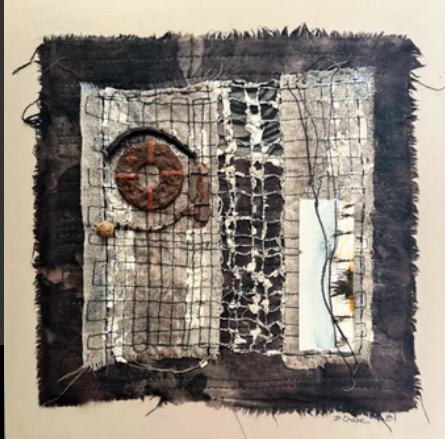

"For nearly fifty years, members of the Acadia Choral Society (ACS) have been spreading joy to their audiences by doing what music does best -- bringing people together. In 1957 Madame Tsuin Hwa Hsu founded a men's double quartet in Ellsworth named Acadia Choral Society and performed with the Bangor Symphony, as well as with Erich Kunzel and Pierre Monteux. The group disbanded at some point in the early 1970s. In 1979 George Emlen founded a second incarnation of ACS in the form of a community chorus. Since then, the group has drawn singers from along the coast from Addison to Bucksport and from MDI to Bangor and beyond. Many members in the group bring previous experience as choral singers, while others come in as newbies, hoping to learn. They all come to find community in singing and performing together."

Maine's Best Barn Hunting on the Road

As the weather turns colder and rainy days set in, there is no better way to spend a cozy afternoon than wandering through Maine's antique shops. With its old homes and a steady flow of travelers from afar, our region offers a treasure trove of art, curiosities and timeless furniture waiting to be discovered.

The road to Mount Desert Island is dotted with inviting stops, each with its own charm. The sign for 1A Relics has become a familiar marker of vacations about to begin, leading to a sprawling space filled with vintage treasures. In Trenton, Two Old Goats Antiquities and Artisans welcomes visitors with an eclectic mix of antiques, collectibles, and fine art from local vendors. In Ellsworth, and you will find The Chicken Barn, a landmark for book lovers where shelves of rare books stretch across the second floor. And if you prefer to stay close to Bar Harbor, Albert Meadow Antiques provides a chance to browse for unique finds right in town. Whether you are hunting for a statement piece or simply enjoying the stories tucked into every corner, antiquing offers a perfect way to explore Maine's history and creativity on a quiet day.

Tucked away on the road to Mount Desert Island, the Trenton Antique Barn is more than a store—it's a portal to the past. Housed within the weathered, grey clapboard of a classic New England barn, the air inside is thick with the scent of aged pine, old leather, and a century of stories. Sunlight slants through dusty windows, illuminating motes of history dancing between the aisles. Here, you'll find the tangible echoes of Maine's heritage: rugged lobster traps piled high, their weathered slats whispering of the frigid Atlantic; elegant, time-smoothed furniture that once graced island cottages; and shelves overflowing with the forgotten treasures of generations—brass nautical instruments, faded patchwork quilts, and stacks of yellowed postcards. It is a place for treasure hunters and dreamers, where every corner holds a discovery and every object has a soul waiting for you to find your piece of its history.

One booth might hold a pristine collection of Depression glass, while its neighbor displays a stack of well-worn wooden skis and a rusted but charming bicycle. From fine Victorian furniture and delicate china to funky 70s kitsch and practical Yankee tools, The Old Creamery celebrates every era without pretense. It's the quintessential Maine antique experience: unassuming, vast, and packed with genuine discovery.



The Chicken Barn

For over half a century, The Chicken Barn has been more than an antique store—it's a Maine institution. The name tells you everything you need to know: this is a place of rustic, no-frills charm, where treasures are waiting to be unearthed. The sprawling, no-nonsense building, once home to thousands of laying hens, now houses a different kind of flock: a vast and mesmerizing collection of the past.

The sheer scale is breathtaking. Aisles and rooms stretch on, packed floor to ceiling with an overwhelming array of history. The air carries the comforting, singular scent of old paper, well-oiled wood, and time. Here, the thrill is in the hunt. You might find a pristine set of china beside a box of old fishing lures, a stack of vintage Life magazines next to a solid oak dresser. It's a place that rewards patience and curiosity, offering a authentic, down-to-earth antique experience that feels uniquely and authentically Maine.

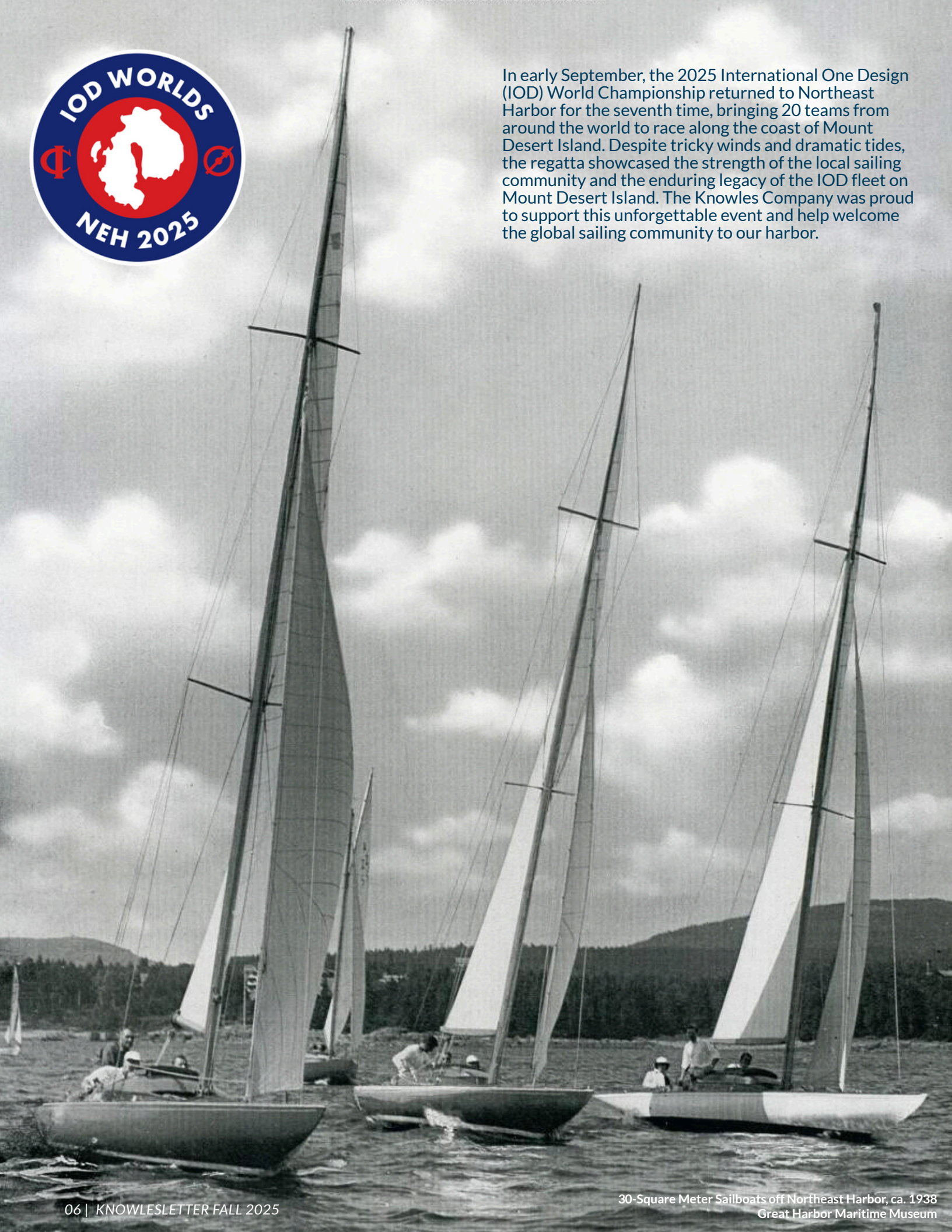

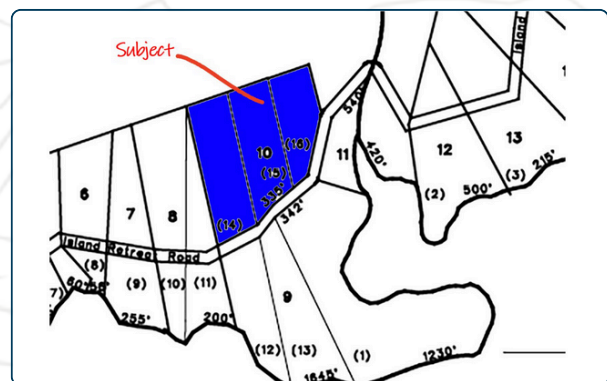

November 1, 2025 Transfer Tax Change

New legislation taking effect on November 1, 2025, will increase Maine's real estate transfer tax on the portion of a property's value exceeding \$1 million, raising it from \$2.20 to \$6.00 per \$500. The bill also includes an exemption for first-time homebuyers who use a Maine State Housing Authority loan program. In most transactions, the transfer tax is split equally between buyer and seller.

Real estate transfer tax rate changes
Property value Rate before Nov. 1, 2025

Rate on and after Nov. 1, 2025

Up to \$1,000,000

- \$2.20 per \$500

Over \$1,000,000

- \$2.20 per \$500 Plus
- \$6.00 per \$500 on the value exceeding \$1,000,000

Note: The tax is typically split evenly between the buyer and the seller.

Tax exemption for first-time homebuyers

The legislation introduces a full exemption from the real estate transfer tax for first-time homebuyers. This applies to both the buyer's and seller's share of the tax, and is available to those who use a mortgage loan program through the Maine State Housing Authority.

New revenue allocation

The revenue from the increased tax will be directed toward affordable housing initiatives. The new distribution model, which goes into effect in fiscal year 2026–2027, includes funding for:

- The Housing First Fund
- The Housing Opportunities for Maine (HOME) Fund
- The Maine Energy, Housing and Economic Recovery Program
- Other affordable housing programs and tax credits

Here's what the new rates mean in practice:

- A \$2M sale will owe \$16,400 after Nov 1 vs. \$8,800 if closed before.
- A \$4M sale will owe \$40,400 after Nov 1 vs. \$17,600 if closed before.
- A \$6M sale will owe \$64,400 after Nov 1 vs. \$26,400 if closed before.

How to calculate it.

Scenario 1: \$1,500,000 Sale - NOT the Seller's Primary Residence

This scenario faces the full combined tax burden.

1. Standard Maine Real Estate Transfer Tax

- Rate: \$2.20 per \$500 of the full sale price.

• Calculation:

- $\$1,500,000 / \$500 = 3,000$
- $3,000 \times \$2.20 = \$6,600$

- Who Pays: Typically split 50/50 between buyer and seller (\$3,300 each).

2. New Maine Housing Property Transfer Tax (Starts Nov. 1, 2025)

- Rate: 2.5% on the portion of the sale price that exceeds \$1,000,000.

• Calculation:

- Amount over \$1 million: $\$1,500,000 - \$1,000,000 = \$500,000$
- Tax = 2.5% of \$500,000 = \$12,500

- Who Pays: This tax is solely the responsibility of the seller.

Total Tax Liability for this Scenario:

- Standard Tax: \$6,600
- Housing Tax: \$12,500
- Grand Total Transfer Tax: \$19,100

Breakdown of Payment:

- Buyer Pays: \$3,300
- Seller Pays: \$3,300 (Standard) + \$12,500 (Housing) = \$15,800

Scenario 2: \$1,500,000 Sale - IS the Seller's Primary Residence

This scenario is exempt from the new, larger tax.

- The sale is exempt from the new 2.5% Maine Housing Property Transfer Tax due to the primary residence exemption.
- Therefore, only the standard transfer tax applies.

- Standard Tax: $(\$1,500,000 / \$500) \times \$2.20 = \$6,600$

BONNIE CHASE, MOUNT DESERT ARTIST



On a farm on Oak Hill Road in Mount Desert, artist Bonnie Chase lives a creative life deeply connected to the natural world, growing vegetables for winter, medicinal herbs for tinctures, and flowers for dyes. Now retired from a career in environmental education and eco-tour guiding, she creates art inspired entirely by the life

growing around her. Her home is filled with natural items collected both locally and globally, which serve as reminders of the earth's beauty.

Chase harvests plants from her garden and the surrounding wild to create everything from dyes and watercolors to woven baskets. To make dye, she places flowers and leaves in sun-filled jars of water, allowing their colors to slowly leach out and create potent pigments. She then soaks fabrics like cotton, linen, or wool in these jars before filtering the dye to create her own watercolor paints by mixing the leftover pigment with gum arabic, honey, and water. This process results in a natural color palette that feels more meaningful to her.

The muted, natural tones she achieves are well-suited to her landscape paintings and studies of plants. Chase finds inspiration not only in the seasons but also in the subtle phases within them, carefully tracking wildflowers and gathering plants at specific times for varied colors. For instance, white Queen Anne's lace yields a yellow dye, while yellow black-eyed Susans create green—a element of surprise that delights her.

She also creates eco prints by pressing flowers and leaves onto fabric or paper, steaming them between metal plates to leave a ghostly impression of the plant in its own unique color. To add depth, Bonnie uses dyes made from rust,





copper, or oak leaf tannins, appreciating how nature's subtle hues harmonize. In her studio, she has countless naturally dyed fabrics, twines, and even handmade brushes, all reflecting her resourcefulness. Her three-dimensional work, such as intricate baskets woven from dried grasses, leaves, and seaweed, showcases the versatility of native plants. Bonnie Chase also teaches at Acadia Senior College

PRO TIPS

Clean your iPhone lenses.

(Wide angle, normal and telephoto)

- check the lenses for any issues like cracks or scratches.
- dust off and clean with soft cotton or eyeglasses microcloth.
- Very important because these lenses are small. Any smudges or fingerprints may degrade the color and sharpness.

Turn on the grid

- go to Settings and scroll down to Camera and turn on the option to display Grid lines.
- This will help you to compose a good horizon line. Cropping later can help but you may lose part of the image depending on how tight the main subject is in the frame.
- These frame lines will not become part of the image.

Adjust your focus & exposure

- using the yellow box in your frame.
 - touch the screen and move the yellow box to correctly focus on a point in the image to ensure it's sharp. This can be especially important when using the portrait mode. If you are not zoomed in usually most of the frame will be sharp.
 - Next to the yellow box is a verticle yellow line which you can adjust the exposure. The slider will adjust the image lighter or darker. Note that moving the camera to another area may change exposure based on what it sees. It's always adjusting to average balance.
 - When you take sunset images note what your seeing and adjust as necessary. It will be more important later if you choose to have your images printed for display.
 - Remember the more you stabilize your phone in any conditions your images will be sharper, especially in low light situations. Another option is to simply brace yourself against something solid, a tree, rock, or another person. Take a breath and shoot!
 - Unless you are shooting something within 5-8ft turn off the flash. Beyond that, it will not be terribly effective..

Making the exposure.

Of course, you may use the main round button on the screen or either of the volume buttons on the left side of the iPhone. Hold as still as possible!

Edit/cropping your images.

You will have very few images that don't need some attention.

- Crop
 - it would be a very rare instance that a professional photographer would not crop images. Look for things that may distract from the overall feel of the image.
 - Note if you crop out a very small portion of the image you may see some degradation in image resolution when enlarged.
 - Color correcting your image. This could be a book in itself so just the basics. You have an "Edit" mode with several options.
 - Exposure (adjust the density first)
 - Saturation (will increase the color saturation)
 - Warmth (this will change the color temperature)
 - Towards late afternoon the color temperature of natural light will be warm or "yellowier". Adjusting this will help bring the color back to the original if needed.
 - Explore these options to understand balance points.

Print your images!

- I have a friend who has 80,000+ images on his phone. Printing select images, matted, and framed with glass is priceless. You will remember the moments every day. There are many online services for Giclee Prints which are archival. The cost these days is about \$11 for an 11x14 or 8 x12. Fifteen years ago this print would have been only available at a professional lab for \$100's of dollars. No plug here, but search for [Finerworks.com](https://finerworks.com) to get an idea of what's available. Always have prints done Giclee on archival paper and they will last generations.

My primary mode of expression is woodblock printmaking. Concepts begin as drawn sketches. I establish general spontaneous forms with ink using a dip pen and brushes. Sharpie and ball-point pens are also employed to draw ornate feather and fur textures. I transfer the drawing to plywood and use Japanese-style hand tools to chisel around each drawn line. Larger and more complex compositions can take weeks to complete. Ink is applied to the woodblock's surface using a rubber brayer. Proper application is essential: too much ink will fill in finely carved details, and too little ink will cause the finished print to look spotty. I place fine art paper on the inked carving. An etching press applies even pressure, and the force transfers ink from the woodblock to the paper. The result is a finished woodblock print.



Lyell Castonguay
Artist, Printmaker

My fascination with animals started with a white dove named Snow. He lived to be 24 years old. Who would have thought a creature with hollow bones could live so long? He inspired me to look at the world outside my studio window.

What are wild animals doing out there? What hidden dramas are unfolding? My woodblock prints probe the depths of their secret lives. I've learned, among other things, that flamingos can stand unscathed in highly acidic water, and snails can gallop when threatened. These intriguing facts enticed me to delve deeper.

I enjoy creating funny and playful images. Often, there's an underlying ecological theme. One example is the impact of encroachment in my piece "New City." Despite the tragic sight of wrens carrying their home away, the image has a prevailing sense of wonder. The viewer can witness these birds enduring despite losing their habitat.

It's difficult to imagine a world without animals, but sadly, their populations are rapidly declining. A study by Cornell University researchers revealed that nearly 3 billion birds have vanished from North America and Canada since 1970. I create art to capture the natural beauty of animals and inspire others to support conservation efforts.

Lyell Castonguay is BIG INK's instructor, event coordinator, and web administrator. He holds a Bachelor of Fine Arts, and his primary subject is the natural world. His favorite artists include Antonio Frasconi, Leonard Baskin, Gustave Doré, and John James Audubon.

Birds are central to Castonguay's art. His interest in the subject began in 2009 when he was gifted two juvenile society finches. The habits and distinct personalities of birds continue to fascinate him, and he keeps doves and finches as his studio companions.

Castonguay's work is in international collections, including the Aomori Museum of Art in Japan and the Archille Bertarelli Collection in Italy.

Castonguay has over a decade of experience working with fellow artists, guiding them through the creative process, and printing their work.

Carand Burnet helped Castonguay facilitate workshops and acted as a digital media producer. She uses a Sony α7S III and edited BIG INK's master class series using industry-leading video, audio, and design programs.

Burnet holds a Bachelor of Fine Arts. In 2021, she earned an audio engineering certificate and has taken video postproduction courses at Maine Media Workshops + College.



Burnet has played the electric guitar since childhood and enjoys composing instrumentals and jamming with friends. She performs with her band, Kioea, at venues and festivals throughout New England. Her music has been selected twice as Bandcamp's "New & Notables." To record her most recent album, she was awarded a Maine ARP Grant through the National Endowment for the Arts.

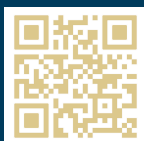

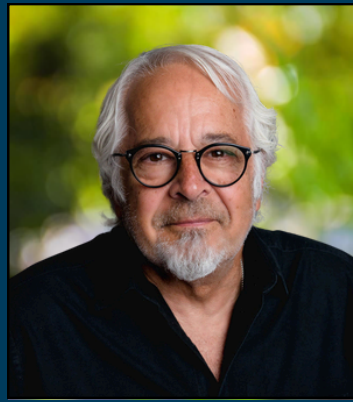
